For the record, I did have a basic VB Script a few years ago to copy data between tables in one Excel and another in another Excel in two different locations, but that was it. ***The following features make this script unique***: 1. It is a VB Script, so it works even if Excel does not have access to a password protected workbook. It

will just ask you to enter a password (if needed). 2. It can handle encrypted and unencrypted password protected workbooks with ease. 3. It can import/export data between 2 different Excels (and more, for that matter). 4. If Excel with all relevant data is not open, it will ask you to open it first. 5. It is entirely customizable and you are not limited to using the below scripts. ***Current Usage***:

KEYMACRO to back up or restore Internet Explorer passwords, you must start the program, as shown below. Start the application and press F2 to save the backup settings. By default, KEYMACRO is configured to create a file with the name of the current computer name, followed by .bak. Press F2 again to create a folder named \Internet Explorer\Passwords. KEYMACRO stores passwords in the registry key HKEY_CURRE

NT_USER\Software\Microsoft\Internet Explorer\Passwords.
Open a Windows Explorer window. Go to Start > Search. Enter regedit and click OK. Press F2 again to open a blank text file, where the backup settings are saved. KEYMACRO is small and can be run from a USB drive and will not overwrite any settings on your PC, because it will create a copy of the registry key. I hope that this information is useful to you!
